5.1 Working Party


All home nations participants reported

- The sport seems to be focussed on developing children
- There is a lot of focus on moving through the divisions as fast as possible
- There is little for adults who participate for enjoyment and this also brings some large hurdles for adult beginners.
- Junior and Under 23 selection being held at races across the Home Nations was widely supported.

A fuller report will be developed and circulated.

Race entries are being made later and later, with competitions looking to have vey low entries and making a loss until very close to the race. The late surge in entries has resulted in races that were being considered to be cancelled getting enough entries to be viable.

The availability of team races at lower division races was widely accepted and should be encouraged.

5.2 Entry analysis for the last few years.

2022 is partially complete as the season is still in progress and an update will be produced at year end and include earlier years - the ranking database has data from 2015/16. 6.2 Interclubs viability (AG 5-20/7)

Various consultations have taken place. As yet there are no volunteers to organise a 2023 race so one will not take place. A paper will be produced.

7 Yearbook

Organisers and officials focussing on rule books. Rules could be a self-published small book

9 Finance Support Update

A further meeting has been held with BC Finance. We are closer to being in a position to pass the book keeping to British Canoeing Finance. A key part of this is the online submission of expenses with appropriate approval.

10 Other Competitions

10.1 'Worlds Test Event'

The test event for the 2023 will be run on 17/18 September 2022. This will be a joint British Canoeing Events and slalom committee event, so will need support from all the volunteers available. A temporary ramp has been built for Extreme Slalom, and will be in place for the British Open.

As of 6th September there were 29 nations entered, 58 MC1, 46 WC1, 78 MK1, 64 WK1, 78 MX1 and 64 WX1. 217 athlete entries were received at that time.

There will be some long days to get all these athletes runs completed, and British Canoeing has expressed it thanks to the Slalom Committee and to all the volunteers involved.

10.2 British Open

The event will be in a championship format but will not be an ICF ranking race. Currently there about 90 entries. The new operators (and Lee Valley) are being more strict on the risk management and documentation of these.

Consideration will be given to a Sunday run for those not qualifying for the Sunday final or an extreme slalom may be considered for the Sunday. AG will investigate the possibilities for the schedule, this could be open to non-slalom athletes.

10.3 2023 World Championships

The 2023 World Championship organising committee are now meeting regularly and investigating ways to make the event even more successful than the last Championships held in the UK. Focus for the group is on the ranking race (10.1).

10.4 Junior/Vet Championships

This is planned to be run alongside Tees this year. This is in hand now. Those wanting to be considered as part of the championships MUST enter the competition, not as an official.

11 2022 ACM

12.2 Invitations to be nominated as ITOs at World Cups in 2023

Nomination forms will be sent out shortly. The form will be circulated to those qualified who meet the British Canoeing Slalom criteria. The resultant list will be reviewed with British Canoeing management before submission to the ICF for consideration.

12.3 Winter non-programme Lee Valley training

Priority to selected, qualifying paddlers who are not on squads. These will be open to all Home Nations. The aim is for the slots to be self-funding, but the Slalom Committee will underwrite the sessions to a maximum amount.

13 Future Meetings

The final meeting of the year will be on Wednesday 26th October principally to discuss ACM business.

There will a face-to-face committee meeting on 27th November the day after the ACM.
