

Criteria for application conflict resolution In Slalom calendar applications

Applications will be considered by the event management coordinator with at least two other nominated members of the BCU Slalom Committee and the following considerations will apply.

1. There is intent to ensure a spread of racing between geographic locations including between the home countries.
2. There is intent that where possible there will be an appropriate split between natural and artificial courses.
3. Positive consideration will be given to applications where there is a history of previous successful events.
4. Late applications will not be considered. In the event that there are a lack of applications for an identified diary slot the committee reserves the right to make arrangements with clubs to run appropriate races – priority will be given to clubs that have already applied to run races but not been successful.
5. Consideration will be given to costing issues (water release and hire fees) in respect of race timing and dates.
6. Where there is a conflict between applications that cannot be resolved on the basis of the stated considerations clubs will be offered the opportunity to move to alternative dates where this is possible.

Where there is conflict between applications that cannot be otherwise resolved and for all applications that cannot be accommodated within the calendar, final consideration and decision will be the responsibility of the full BCU Slalom Committee.
